Sketch of Contact (Not to scale)



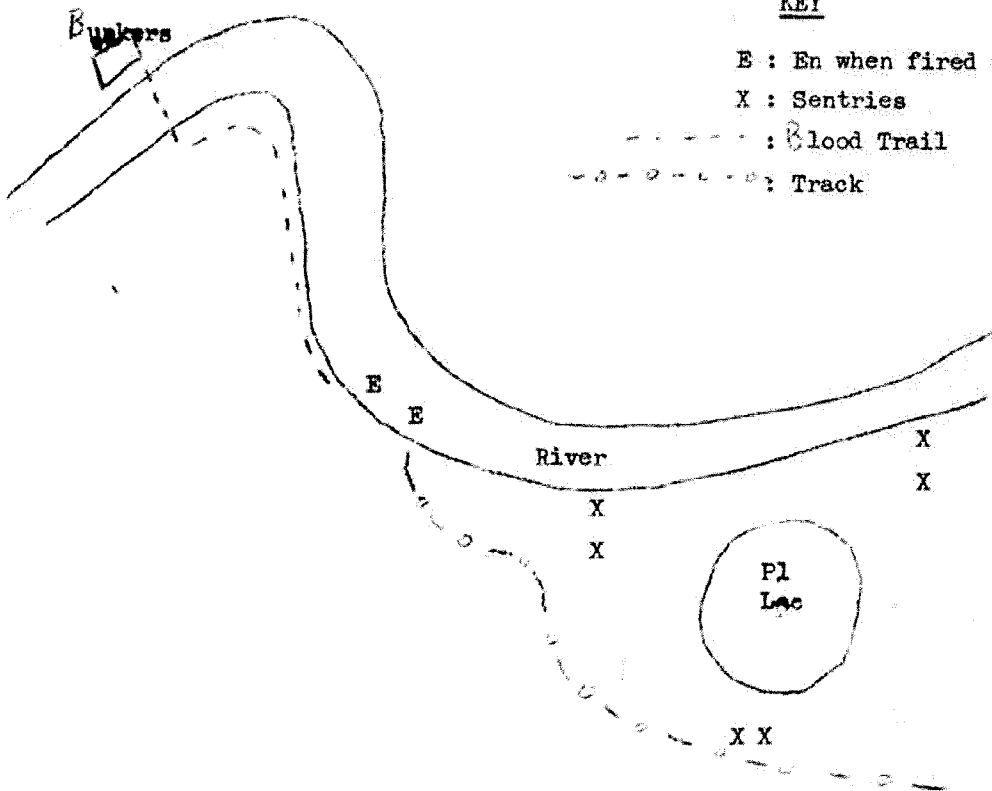

7. To search pl AO and ambush likely enemy used tracks.
8. On reaching the S Sach River the pl was deployed while a track was being investigated for the purpose of ambushing. Sentries were posted forward on the river bank. They had only just been posted when they spotted two enemy crossing the river 120 - 150m upstream. The sentries fired and killed one. The other was wounded and crawled back out of sight. A third enemy was seen on the bank and engaged but he too went out of sight. A sweep was conducted and a blood trail found. This was followed for about 200m and lead to a bunker system. The bunker system was investigated the next morning. The blood trail ended in the complex but no body could be found. (See Annex 'A' for sketch).
9. The ground was flat except for the steep river banks. Visibility limited around river to 150m. Vegetation around the river very thick. Visibility 10m.

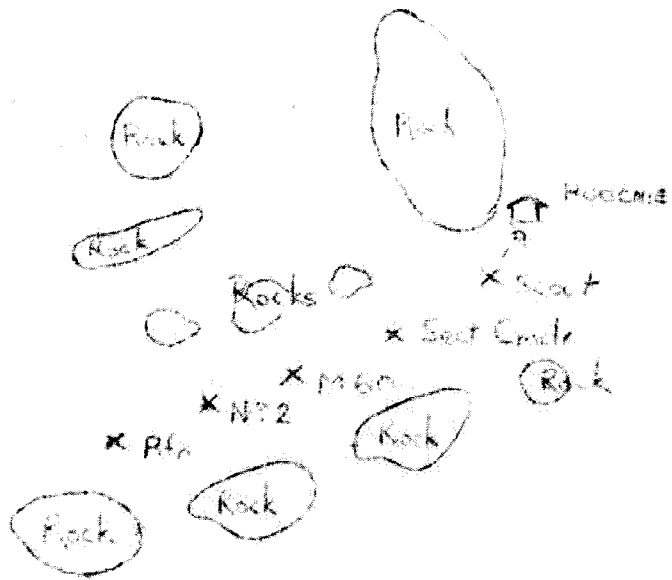

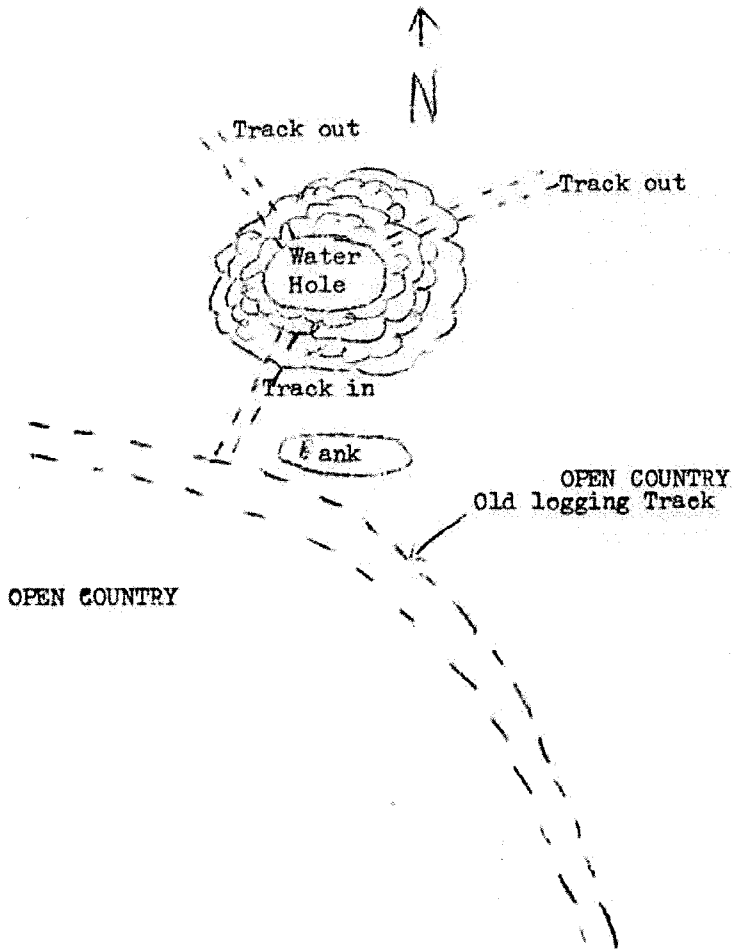

 8. A half pl strength patrol had stopped when noises and chopping was heard about 200m to the front. On further investigation a track was found leading into the camp. From the noise it was estimated the camp contained at least 20 people. The remainder of the pl moved forward to the recce ptl. A detailed recce was almost impossible because of the open ground to the front. It was decided to leave the attack until the next morning. A half pl ptl was left to watch the camp and attempt to recce further. This was done in semi darkness. The next morning the remainder of the Coy moved forward to the camp. 4 M60s were then taken forward to a small bank. These guns opened the contact. This was followed by Arty and Gunship fire. A sweep was then conducted through the camp. One M60 was found plus a large amount of gear. (See Annex 'A' for sketch).
 9. The camp was situated around a water hole. The vegetation in this area was very thick. Visibility 15m. Outside this area the ground was fairly open with visibility up to 200m.
